

## **Dane County Intervention Services**

### **1. Addictive Disorders Treatment Program Alcohol Rehab Center (part of the William S. Middleton Veterans Hospital)**

- Summary: The Center offers substance abuse treatment and detoxification services ranging from inpatient to residential to outpatient treatment (long and short-term).
- Target population: Veterans in need of substance abuse treatment and detoxification

### **24. Neighborhood Intervention Program (Part of Dane Co. Dept. of Human Services)**

- Summary: The Neighborhood Intervention Program works to provide opportunities to Dane County Youth which enrich their social and educational experiences. It seeks to become involved in risk cycles that are part of the growth of an adolescent. It does this through a

variety of programs. These programs are divided into two categories: community supervision and prevention and early intervention services.

- Prevention and Early Intervention Services:
  - BIG (Behavioral Intervention Group): BIG provides group meetings for male and female students in middle or high school who struggle with anger management issues.
  - Gang Squad: The Gang Squad is for all youth in Dane County who are affiliated with gangs or who are in danger of being pressured to join a gang. It provides workshops, seminars, training, and street level outreach.
  - Madison Spartans Youth Basketball: Spartans Youth Basketball is a competitive basketball league designed to give low income and at risk youth exposure to tournament basketball play. It teaches life skills, honor, and integrity.
  - RT – ADDS (Right Track – Assessment, Deflection, Deferment, and Stabilization): RT – ADDS is an early intervention service for male youth ages 10 - 16 who have committed minor offenses or are at risk for involvement in the justice system. It is a 14-week program designed to redirect bad behavior into good.
  - STARS (Striving Towards Academic Responsibility and Success): STARS is for African American males ages 10 to 14 who are not involved in the justice system, but who could benefit from cultural, academic, and social assistance. It provides help in core subjects such as math, science, and language arts.
  
- Community Supervision:
  - Intensive Supervision Services: This program is for youths ages 13-17 who have had significant interaction with law enforcement. It utilizes monitoring devices and curfews and lasts between 3 and 6 months.
  - RePlay (Re-directive Pro-social Learning Alternative for Youth): RePlay is a collaborative program between the Madison Metropolitan School District and the Dane Co. Human Services Department. It is for 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade boys who have had chronic behavior problems. It can take up to 12 students for one semester.
  - Right Track Plus: This program is designed to prevent further involvement with the court by males and females already adjudicated delinquent. It provides such activities as study tables and life choice discussion groups.
  - Right Track Second Chance: Right Track Second Chance is for males ages 13-17 who are delinquent. It teaches accountability and the skills to avoid re-offending. It encourages youth to think before they act.
  - Weekend Report Center: This is a program for youth ages 10-17 who have violated a part of their court order. It can be used as an alternative to detention.

## **25. New Start Program (part of Meriter Hospital)**

- Summary: This program designs programs and assigns services to give the amount of help needed for each person to move forward toward recovery.
