 - Community Supervision:
 - Intensive Supervision Services: This program is for youths ages 13-17 who have had significant interaction with law enforcement. It utilizes monitoring devices and curfews and lasts between 3 and 6 months.
 - RePlay (Re-directive Pro-social Learning Alternative for Youth): RePlay is a collaborative program between the Madison Metropolitan School District and the Dane Co. Human Services Department. It is for 7th and 8th grade boys who have had chronic behavior problems. It can take up to 12 students for one semester.

- Right Track Plus: This program is designed to prevent further involvement with the court by juveniles already adjudicated delinquent.
- Right Track Second Chance: Right Track Second Chance is for males ages 13-17 who are delinquent. It teaches accountability and the skills to avoid re-offending.
- Weekend Report Center: This is a program for youth ages 10-17 who have violated a part of their court order. It can be used as an alternative to detention.
- Prevention and Early Intervention Services:
 - BIG (Behavioral Intervention Group): BIG is a group for male and female students in middle or high school who struggle with anger management issues.
 - Gang Squad: The Gang Squad is for all youth in Dane County who are affiliated with gangs or who are in danger of being pressured to join a gang.
 - Madison Spartans Youth Basketball: Spartans Youth Basketball is a competitive basketball league designed to give low income and at risk youth exposure to tournament basketball play. It teaches life skills, honor, and integrity.
 - RT – ADDS (Right Track – Assessment, Deflection, Deferment, and Stabilization): RT – ADDS is an early intervention service for male youth ages 10 - 16 who have committed minor offenses or are at risk for involvement in the justice system. It is a 14-week program.
 - STARS (Striving Towards Academic Responsibility and Success): STARS is for African American males ages 10 to 14 who are not involved in the justice system, but who could benefit from cultural, academic, and social assistance.

 - STOP (Sexual Abuse Treatment Offender Program): This program provides outpatient treatment for male and female youth who act out sexually. STOP provides individual care and emphasizes a team approach to treatment. It focuses on accountability, consequences of behavior, and future risk factors.
 - Specialized Group Care: Specialized Group Care is a model that incorporates Treatment Foster Care and Group Home Care. There is a capacity of four foster youth in this program. Its goal is to offer the services of a group home, but the environment of a foster

home. The program includes skills training, therapy, psychological services, and case management services.

- Treatment Foster Care: Treatment Foster Care offers case management and weekly visits from a case manager. Foster families are skilled and committed to the process. The program accepts referrals from all 72 Wisconsin counties. It serves youth ages birth to 18 who have been diagnosed with a wide variety of disorders and who may be at risk for residential placement due to emotional and behavioral problems.
