Juvenile:

1. Dane County Juvenile Detention Center (part of Dane County Juvenile Court Program)

- Summary: The Juvenile Detention Center seeks to provide a physically and emotionally safe place for juveniles while placed there temporarily by the court. It also tries to provide the youth with the opportunity to learn skills that will help them to contribute to society once they leave the facility. The Center's capacity is 24 juveniles.

2. Neighborhood Intervention Program (part of Dane County Department of Human Services)

- Summary: The Dane County Department of Human Services seeks to offer cost-effective services and programs that improve the lives of citizens. The services promote independence, respect diversity, support the community, and promote safety. The Neighborhood Intervention Program works to provide opportunities to Dane County Youth which enrich their social and educational experiences. It seeks to become involved in risk cycles that are part of the growth of an adolescent. It does this through a variety of programs. These programs are divided into two categories: (1) community supervision and (2) prevention and early intervention services.

 - Intensive Supervision Services: This program (one of the community supervision programs) is for youths ages 13-17 who have had significant interaction with law enforcement. It utilizes monitoring devices and curfews and lasts between 3 and 6 months.
 - RePlay (Re-directive Pro-social Learning Alternative for Youth): RePlay (one of the community supervision programs) is a collaborative program between the Madison Metropolitan School District and the Dane Co. Human Services Department. It is for 7th and 8th grade boys who have had chronic behavior problems. It can take up to 12 students for one semester.

3. Connections Counseling

- Summary: Connections Counseling is a certified outpatient drug and alcohol and mental health clinic. It creates a safe and supportive atmosphere for young people and their families as they work towards hope and healing.

6. CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocate)

- Summary: The CASA program uses volunteers to help children who are temporarily under the court's jurisdiction and the welfare system. The volunteers make sure that all practitioners in the system remain sensitive to the needs of the child.

7. Dane County District Attorney – Deferred Prosecution

- Summary: The Deferred Prosecution Unit (DPU) is a program within the Dane County District Attorney's office in which defendants that meet certain eligibility requirements can avoid adjudication and sentencing. They must agree to and complete one or more assessments or programs that the DPU determines is necessary. They must also take measures to ensure that they do not repeat their criminal behavior.
- Target population: There are several standards for participation in the program: (1) the assistant district attorney assigned to the case must make the referral; (2) the DPU is not obligated to accept any case; (3) the defendant must be 17 or older; (4) the defendant must not have a prior criminal conviction or criminal record; (5) the defendant must agree to participation; (6) the defendant must accept responsibility for the crime; and (7) the defendant must meet with DPU staff for an eligibility interview.

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11. ARC Community Services – Dayton Street House
